Some of these activities include volunteering in their communities, researching alongside esteemed faculty and studying abroad. The financial freedom allows Scholars to focus on their passions. Following graduation, students pursue careers in healthcare, education, policy work, law and finance.

"Like many Annexstad Scholars, Al and I learned at a young age that one can grow from circumstances out of one's control," shares Foundation Co-founder and President Cathy Annexstad. "We grew up together and bonded over our shared experience of losing a parent. In search of mentors, we called upon our friends, families, neighbors, colleagues and acquaintances to ask for help and look for advice. Al and I took initiative in our lives to not let our circumstances in losing a parent define us. We owe our successes in all areas of our life to the connections we have made and the relationships we have built. Our perspective

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investing in yourself series:

A GUIDE TO POST- GRADUATION SUCCESS



During meetings in Chicago in November 2023, Annexstad Family Foundation Alumna Shawn Sanford sparked an idea with Foundation leadership: hosting a virtual event series to share real and raw insights with Scholars and Alumni on life after college. The series would reveal both its triumphs and challenges. Shawn recognized a gap in receiving advice and insight from her own experience as a new graduate. Insight into finding an apartment, finding a non-predatory car loan and knowing what to look for in a job offer beyond the salary and more. In collaboration with the Foundation, the **Investing in Yourself** series was born. The purpose of the series is to discuss post-graduation topics and to inspire Scholars to invest their time and energy into becoming the best versions of themselves in the future.

Shawn's experience as an Annexstad Alumna is unique in that she paved the way as the first recipient and graduate of the Leaders for Tomorrow scholarship. She graduated from the University of Notre Dame in 2008 with a degree in American and Africana studies. Following her graduation, Shawn pursued a role with AT&T in her hometown of Chicago. Shawn shared in the first virtual event that her first year post-graduation was challenging as a first-generation college graduate with little support as she didn't know what she didn't know. Shawn says, "I wish I had been more forthcoming in asking questions about things like my 401k and investing, but I hope through this event series that I can help students feel like they have the chance to ask those questions."

In the first virtual event, Shawn also discussed her life and journey in her hometown of Chicago beyond that first year at AT&T. From having her daughter, to switching sectors from Telecommunications to Association Management, to the excitement and nervousness of buying

her first home. Shawn took the webinar audience through the ups and downs of her pathway from graduation to 2024.

Shawn's first event focused primarily on personal finance and sharing her own personal experiences as a young adult. A few key takeaways she imparted on the Annexstad Scholar cohort included:

- Credit scores are incredibly important.
 Don't let anyone influence your credit score by co-signing or allowing them to "use" your credit.
- Live within your means by establishing and sticking to a budget.
- When comparing car loans, look out for predatory lenders – if it seems too good to be true, it probably is!
- Save money for a rainy day, no matter what the forecast looks like. Life will always throw you curveballs.

Shawn concluded the event with a call to action for the cohort to continue to ask for help and to reach out for support.

investing in your future

Shawn Sanford was joined by longtime friend of the Foundation, Tasha Murdoff for this seminar. As the Chief Financial Officer of AMA Investments, Tasha has previously presented to Annexstad Scholars and Alumni on personal finance best practices. Tasha is a first-generation college graduate and was able to speak about her experience on how she set herself up for financial success. Here are a few takeaways from Tasha's savvy insights regarding what a first-year college student should know as it relates to their personal finances:

- 1 Time is on your side... sometimes the hardest thing to do is start.

 Money is intimidating. It can be challenging to wrap your head around if you don't break it down. One thing Annexstad Scholars and Alumni have on their side is time. The power of compound interest and time allows investments and savings to grow with interest.
- 2 | Save, even \$1...it will set you up for a better financial future.

 A dollar today could have a different valuation than a dollar tomorrow.

 Starting small by setting modest financial goals can help you set yourself up for financial success in the future.



- 3 | Face your finances head on, even if it feels intimidating. Finances are not going to go away! Facing your finances head on will help set expectations and alleviate anxiety.
- 4 | Build up your emergency savings; unexpected things happen in life.

 Things happen in life even when you don't see them coming. It it is important to have emergency savings to help navigate unexpected changes. Cars break down, hospital visits occur, hot water heaters run out having emergency savings will keep a challenge from turning into a crisis.
- 5 | Ensure you have accounts through a financial institution that works best for you.

It is highly recommended to have a personal basic checking and basic savings account. Explore a financial institution that works best for you. There are banks and credit unions that may best serve your needs. Ask thorough questions regarding fees and interest rates with your financial institution.

- 6 | Explore high-yield savings accounts.
 A high-yield savings account might
 be a smart fit for you. Do your research
 to ensure you are getting a rate that
 makes your money work for you.
- 7 Research your benefits when presented with a job offer, this can help you take advantage of retirement savings.

Be sure to look at 401k contribution matches. If offered, these could help increase your retirement savings.

investing in a trusted mentor

In the final installment of the *Investing in Yourself* series, Shawn Sanford was joined by her longtime mentor, **Lauren Robinson**, to discuss the significance of having a trusted mentor. "A mentor is a trusted advisor, someone who is lovingly honest," **Lauren Robinson** shared. "It's someone who cares about you enough to share hard truths. In a world where everyone wants to be friends, a true friend is someone who tells you what you need to improve upon."

Lauren emphasized the importance of integrity in mentorship. "Your mentor needs to have integrity and sincerely want you to succeed. As a mentor, I wanted to give back. I've always been involved in tutoring, youth development and mentoring both formally and informally. I wanted to be the mentor I never had and invest in future generations."

Lauren and Shawn's relationship began organically 20 years ago and has been mutually beneficial. "It's bilateral; it's not just the protégé taking. Both of us are benefiting from it," Lauren explained. She underscored the beauty of witnessing a mentee's growth and development, expressing her fortune to be involved in Shawn's journey.

Beyond academic talents, Lauren highlighted the necessity of social, verbal, written communication and interpersonal skills. "We need a trusted advisor to help us navigate work situations, address challenges or build our careers. A mentor can introduce you to people who can help in various areas."

Lauren advised seeking mentors who are already experienced in mentoring others and stressed the value of diverse perspectives. "It's important to get out of our echo chambers and cultivate constructive relationships with people who are different from us."

She recommended using career center resources, staying connected with professors and leveraging professional networks like The Annexstad Family Foundation Alumni network. On LinkedIn, young professionals should introduce themselves with a sincere note and request a brief meeting to seek advice, not a job.

Lauren's tips included being respectful of a mentor's time, preparing questions and following up with a prompt and thoughtful thank-you email. She encouraged mentees to ask for recommendations on people or companies to connect with for growth in their field.

Shawn expressed gratitude for Lauren's mentorship, highlighting the safe space Lauren created for vulnerability and difficult discussions. "Even when there was conflict, we could disagree and still be okay. The biggest thing is you allowed me to be vulnerable without judgment."

Lauren found Shawn additional mentors, showing her the importance of having multiple sources of guidance. In turn, Shawn emphasized the value of showing appreciation to mentors, building relationships and understanding the mentor's "professional love language."

The mentor-mentee relationship is invaluable for personal and professional growth. A mentor provides honest feedback, introduces new opportunities and supports the mentee's development. As Shawn and Lauren's story illustrates, a trusted mentor is an essential guide on the path to success.

navigating the job market:

NETWORK WITH CONFIDENCE

In my Career Civility blog, I have openly discussed my nonlinear career path, the "corprenuer" route I've decided to take and my corporate job search process. My perspective and advice stem from extensive job search experience. Recently, I conducted a survey within the Career Civility community and received the following insights:

why are you currently looking for a job?

- **34**% of respondents are unhappy at their current job
- **21**% want to level up their career
- 18% have been laid off

what has been the hardest part of searching for a job?

- 47% find networking the most challenging aspect
- 78% lack confidence in their networking skills
- 75% need communication templates to reach out to recruiters and hiring managers

I didn't grasp the importance of networking until I pursued my Master of Science in Communication at Northwestern University. There, I learned the value of building a personal network and effective networking communication. The tips I've compiled here aim to boost your networking confidence and provide practical templates.

5 STEPS TO GAIN NETWORKING CONFIDENCE

1 define your personal brand

A personal brand helps clarify your identity. For guidance, visit www.CareerCivility.com and read the "How To Advance Your Career By Communicating Your Personal Brand" article on the blog.

2 | create a professional board of directors

Assemble a group of mentors and advisors who can offer career guidance. This could include business partners, managers, colleagues, friends or industry leaders.

3 | start meeting with people

Aim to meet with one person each week, either virtually or in person.

4 | come to the conversation prepared

Be curious about their career path, ask specific questions about their job or industry and find ways to offer your help.

5 | pay it forward

Always think about how you can assist the other person by asking, "How can I help you?" This approach quickly demonstrates your value in networking interactions.

Subject: Would you be open to connecting?

"We have not yet been introduced and I am taking a leap of faith in sending this message.

I see we have some parallels in terms of the work we are doing/have done. Specifically related to [mutual connections]. I am looking to learn more about [specific interests] and thought you might be a great resource. In return, I'm here to support you however I can.

Would you have time to connect sometime later this month?

Appreciate it in advance!"

Follow up email.

"Hello [name]. Did you catch my last email? I know work and life are busy. Would next week work to meet? If you don't have time to meet right now, we can reconnect in the fall. All my best,"

2 | recruiter/hiring manager communication

"Hello [name]. I just applied for [role] that you are hiring for. With my experience in [relevant experience] I'd love to discuss how I could be an asset to your team. If you believe my candidacy warrants a further conversation, please contact me at [info]."

3 | status of your application/interview

"Hello [name]. I appreciate your time. I'm wondering if you have an update on the next steps or a timeline for the [role] position? I'm wrapping up other interviews but want to prioritize this role. Thank you for the insight!"

4 | active networking conversation

"I'm curious... how would I be able to help you? My network is your network! I'd be happy to help in any way I can."

5 | paying it forward

"Hello [name]. I'd like to introduce you to [name]. We were catching up and realized we have mutual connections. I thought you both might benefit from connecting. I'll let you take it from here!"

6 | networking with friends

"Hello [name]. It's funny how we've been friends for so long and I still have much to learn about the work you do. I'm currently exploring new opportunities. Any chance we could get together and talk about our career paths?"

7 | networking with a colleague

"Hello [name]. We haven t worked together closely, but I admire your work. Would you be open to connecting to learn more about each other's roles?"

8 | thank you

"Hello [name]. Before the day gets away from us, thank you for giving me some of your time this week. I really appreciated it and enjoyed [insert takeaway from the conversation]. Thank you so much!"


VETERAN STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP

Al Annexstad: A Philanthropic Leader's Legacy

Al Annexstad was an extraordinary person whose strong character, unwavering values and dedication to education left an indelible mark on the lives of many. From his humble beginnings to his rise as Chairman at Federated Insurance, to his devoted partnership with his wife Cathy, Al's life journey was a testament to the power of resiliency, entrepreneurial spirit and philanthropy.

At age five, Al lost his father and worked to support his family. At nine, he struck his first business deal with a store owner, whom Al agreed to pay \$1 a week for a year so he could purchase a bike for his paper route. Al's mother, Alice, provided his first example of integrity, serving others and the power of dedicated work.

Al completed his bachelor's degree at Minnesota State University, Mankato and started as a sales representative with Federated Insurance Companies. His record sales quickly propelled him to president and CEO in 1999 and chairman a year later. Al's strategies transformed Federated Insurance from a regional company into a prominent national organization with thousands of employees operating in 49 states. In 2005, Al was inducted into the Minnesota Business Hall of Fame.

Al attributed his success to his wife Cathy. Together, they founded The Annexstad Family Foundation in 2000, awarding the first Scholarship to a Gustavus Adolphus College student in honor of Alice Annexstad.

"Annexstad Scholars are a testament to the power of vision and perseverance," said Al. "The essence of leadership is the ability to transform vision into reality. A leader sees a path to a promising future that they themselves first walk before taking the hands of others." The ripple effect of the Annexstad Family Foundation's Scholarship programs allow individuals to become leaders in their chosen fields and to develop communities, families and societies.

In July 2023, Al's journey on this earth came to an end, but his legacy lives on in those he impacted. The Foundation will continue to be a beacon of hope and opportunity for future generations, awarding new Scholarships for years to come. May his legacy inspire us all to dream big, pay it forward and make the world a better place.

In addition to The Annexstad Family Foundation's support, Maya and Tanner have utilized campus resources and services. "NDSU is a student-focused, land-grant, research university that strives to provide access to students from diverse backgrounds," says **Laura Oster-Aaland**, NDSU Vice Provost for Student Affairs and Institutional Equity. "We believe in students' ability to overcome challenges, and we provide them with the tools and support to succeed at NDSU and in life. "The Tuition Award Program fully covers base tuition and student fees for Pell-eligible North Dakota and Minnesota students with family incomes of \$80,000 or less for their first and second years at NDSU."

As they work toward their degrees, Maya and Tanner aim to become classroom leaders who will inspire their future students for years to come.

The Annexstad Family Foundation (AFF) first partnered with Pomona College in Claremont, CA, in 2016 with the goal to support deserving and determined undergraduate students through the Leaders for Tomorrow (LFT) Scholarship program. The Foundation was eager to partner with Pomona due to their commitment to offering an engaging and supportive educational environment to help students pursue passions inside and outside of the classroom. As with other LFT partners, Pomona selects the recipients for the Scholarship program from the incoming class of first-year students. Since the Fall of 2016, AFF has worked closely with campus leadership in development, financial aid and admissions to help create a community of Scholars and offer holistic support.

"Pomona College aspires for all students to flourish and develop lives of meaning during their time on campus. This means creating and maintaining equitable experiences for first-generation and low-income students — and every student at the College," says President **G. Gabrielle Starr**. "We are national leaders in educational access — and we have been for decades — because we prioritize financial support for tuition, technology, student health insurance and other critical needs. We also provide broad experiential learning opportunities that

prepare our students to excel after graduation, robust on-campus health and wellness programs and a diverse and tight-knit campus community where meaningful, lasting relationships are forged and all members aim to support and guide one another."

"There is something very special about Pomona; you can feel it when you step on campus," shares Elin Wahman, Director of Strategic Initiatives for The Annexstad Family Foundation. "Beyond the beautiful natural surroundings of the physical campus, Pomona offers an environment where Scholars can commit to their studies but also discover and invest in their interests in research, art, community development and leadership. In my experience working with Pomona, staff and College leadership have a sincere and personal commitment to student success and want to ensure Scholars can maximize and recognize their potential during their four years and beyond."

their experiences and foster community.



To date, the Foundation has supported nine LFT Scholars at Pomona; four of those recipients have graduated. Currently, five LFT Scholars are enrolled. Scholars have pursued studies in areas such as Public Policy, Cognitive Psychology, Chemistry and Media Studies. Previously one student was awarded the LFT Scholarship per year. In January 2023, the Foundation committed to supporting two new Scholars per year. The goal is to grow the Scholarship cohort to continue to expand the Annexstad Scholar community in the Claremont area.
